The Guangzhou International Award for Urban Innovation (the Guangzhou Award) is co-sponsored by the United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), the World Association of the Major Metropolises (Metropolis) and the City of Guangzhou. The aim of the Guangzhou Award is to recognize innovation in improving social, economic and environmental sustainability in cities and regions and, in so doing, to advance the prosperity and quality of life of their citizens. Presented biennially, the award encourages innovation in public policy, projects, business models and practices.

The Guangzhou Institute for Urban Innovation was established in 2012 under the framework of the Guangzhou Award. The Institute is conceived as an international network of experts and institutions dedicated to furthering urban innovation concepts, tools and methodologies. Its members include research and academic institutions, professional associations, community-based organizations, industry leaders and individual experts.




Case studies and analysis of lessons learned provide an important resource for capacity-building activities. These include conferences, seminars, workshops, study tours and exhibitions. Such as Workshop for Thought Leaders: Learning from Urban Innovation, Seminar on Urban Innovation, Plenary Meeting of the Guangzhou Institute for Urban Innovation. These are tailored for city and civic leaders and designed to promote dialogue between public, private and civil society leaders. The biennial "Guangzhou International Urban Innovation Seminar" uses a unique format and methodology to share lessons learned from each of the 15 shortlisted initiatives of each award cycle with hundreds of city and civic leaders and experts in attendance. These dialogues and capacity building events are organized together with the Institute's partners both in China and abroad.


