#### 2. METROPOLIS TRAINING INSTITUTE

#### 2.1. E-Government Training Program for Foreign City Officials. SEOUL

The Seoul Human Resource Development Center (SHRDC), which hosts the headquarters of Metropolis International Training Institute (MITI), has successfully conducted "the e-Government Training Program for Foreign City Officials" from August 19 to August 26, 2015.

With 12 participants from Sao Paulo (Brazil), Guangzhou (China), Wuhan (China), Pelileo (Ecuador), Quito (Ecuador), Shiraz (Iran), Jakarta (Indonesia), Ulaanbaatar (Mongolia), Warsaw (Poland), Ulyanovsk (Russia), Doha (Qatar), the program shared best cases of e-Government initiated by Seoul Metropolitan Government (SMG).

During the program, participants had an opportunity to learn more about Seoul's innovative and best practices in e-Government as well as to network with IT-professionals, researchers and other city officials. Lectures on several e-Government related subjects were delivered: e-Government initiatives of Seoul, a smart city and e-

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Government in Korea, the use of IT in Seoul's Traffic Management, e-Government administrative reforms, and Big Data Innovation. Also, cultural tours and technical visits to Seoul's e-Government facilities, such as the Seoul Transport Operation & Information Service (TOPIS), and other related site visits were included in the program.

#### **3. METROPOLIS WOMEN NETWORK**

#### Metropolis Women International Network adds more antennas

Since the latest Board of Directors Annual Meeting held in Buenos Aires in May, the Metropolis Women International Network has gained three new antennas and currently has a total of eighteen.

Bogota, Quito and Caracas have all joined the network thanks to the great work and dedication of the Vice-presidency for Latin America, currently held by the city of Buenos Aires.

The Network is currently working to develop regional themed agendas as well as a position paper on large cities and women. In parallel, it is also working to implement gender mainstreaming in all of the association's activities and areas, as well as in preparing the agenda for Habitat III. In this regard, Vice-president for Latin America Marina Klemensiewicz represented the Women International Network at the "Cities for Life" forum on 31 August and 1 September in Medellin, where she met Gloria Uribe from the Municipality of Medellin.





We would like to take advantage of this opportunity to congratulate and thank Francina Vila for all her work as president of the Network over the past years. Her brief but intense time in this position has been key in taking the Women International Network to the next level, becoming a full member of the association's Board of Directors for the first time in 10 years.

We want to thank Francina Vila for her commitment to our association and wish her all the best in her new adventure.

#### **4. PARTICIPATION IN INTERNATIONAL EVENTS**

4.1. On June 29th and 30th 2015, the Uraía Platform organized its first capacity building activity in Oslo, Norway, on "Public-Private Partnerships Negotiation for SMART City Management".

More than 35 representatives from local governments and their associations, private sector, research centers, civil society and international organizations from Europe, Africa, Latin America and Asia, participated in the first Capacity-building Workshop of the Uraía Platform on Public-Private Partnerships Negotiation for SMART City Management in Oslo on June 29 and 30 organized in partnership between FMDV and UN-Habitat.

Metropolis, as the World Association of Major Metropolises, was invited to present its experience in the field of application of new technologies to improve urban management through one of its 13 initiatives: "Smart, sustainable and inclusive slum development". Renu Khosla, Director at CURE (Center for Urban and Regional Excellence), was in charge of presenting the project that is leading the Indian city of Agra and is developing a new interface on mobile phones to instigate public participation in slum communities.

During the two-day Workshop - including a field visit to Oslo's SMART City initiatives, panel discussions, round tables and informal discussions -, the participants shared their experiences and knowledge on negotiating and implementing Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs) in the field of SMART technologies for improving public services. The representative from the City of Porto Alegre (Brazil), for example, shared its Open Data policy called "Data PoA". The representative from the Municipality of Kinondoni, Tanzania, shared its program to collect taxes through a mobile phone application. The City of Johannesburg, South Africa, spoke about its experience of establishing a PPP contract in public lightning. Representatives from the private sector as Veolia or Change Tomorrow presented their work with local governments. Representatives from institutions such as Nomadéis, OCDE or Instituto Superiore Mario Boella, gave



specific recommendations on how local governments should implement PPPs for SMART management. Some of these recommendations are: the careful evaluation of the local government's capacities; a balanced distribution of risks and potential benefits between city administrations, the private stakeholder and citizens; the careful examination of the business partner, and the adaptation of PPP frameworks to technological innovations in fast-changing contexts.

The Workshop highlighted common concerns and shared difficulties, the need for fostering experience exchange and dialogue between the private and public sector as well as among cities that often face similar problems and challenges in the negotiation of PPPs and in the provision of public services. The informal, participatory and inclusive format of the Workshop allowed for engaging discussions and an indepth analysis of the needs of local governments in the process of establishing and implementing PPPs involving SMART technologies.

The discussions of the Workshop will inform a set of Guidelines aiming at supporting local governments in their negotiation of contracts with the private sector for the implementation of SMART technologies applied to municipal management. It should establish a roadmap with main steps to prepare and negotiate a PPP contract, keys elements of success, main risks and difficulties encountered and mistakes to avoid.

## 4.2. Metropolis gives support to Golden Adobe Award ad consolidates its engagement with Iranian cities

The **Fifth Executive Board Meeting of Asian Mayors Forum** was successfully held from 29<sup>th</sup> August to 1<sup>st</sup> September 2015 in the cities of **Tehran and Qazvin**, Iran. The event gathered many member cities of Metropolis such as Tehran, Mashhad, Isfahan, Shiraz and Karaj, to mention a few. More than 300 participants from Asian cities and international organizations participated. In addition, three technical parallel sessions were conducted simultaneously on the following topics: Sustainable Urban Transportation, Culture and Economy of Urban Tourism ,and the Cultural Committee of UCLG-MEWA.

Metropolis International Manager Agnès Bickart represented the Secretary General in this event which was a unique opportunity for Metropolis to strenghten its relations with Iranian cities and alert on the Global agenda for urban development toward COP21 and Habitat III. Official meetings with Honorable Mayor Ghalibaf, the Head of Municipality Communications and International Affairs Tehran Mr Gilabadi, Mr Mozafari Communications & International Affairs Center Vice President, and Deputy Mayor Mr Hashemi were held on this occasion. Metropolis also met with the former Mayor of Mashhad Mr Pezhman, new head of Mashhad office for International matters Mr Sharbatdar and Director of International Cooperation Office at Mashhad Municipality (ISCO) Mr. Isfahanizadeh.

Metropolis confirmed its support to the <u>Tehran Golden Adobe Award</u> and Secretary General Felip Roca will be guest of honor at the 2nd Edition to be held October 31, 2015, in Tehran.

#### 4.3. Local and regional government networks at the Post-2015 Summit.

As a member of the Global Taskforce for Local Governments towards Habitat III, Metropolis traveled to New York in the framework of the United Nations Sustainable Development Summit held from the 25 to the 27 September 2015.

The Mayor of Johannesburg and co-president of Metropolis who was ratified by the Board of Director in Buenos Aires to lobby internationally for the supporting access to basic services and social inclusion, traveled to New York to represent Metropolis network and enrich the discourse around the SDGs and the New urban agenda.

Mpho Parks Tau participated to the side-event co-hosted by UNCDF, the United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), the Government of Uganda on the margins of the 70th UN General Assembly to identify innovative models which can strengthen the capacity, governance, service delivery, and financial ability of local governments to 7



meet the SDGs. Parks Tau mentioned that "in Johannesburg we are used to implement Innovative financing solutions". In addition, **Mr. Khalifa Sall**, Mayor of Dakar and president of UCLGA highlighted "the importance that global goals are now done with local governments".

On the top of that, the Global Taskforce made a joint declaration to mark the summit for the adoption of the Post-2015 Agenda, entitled: <u>"All SDGs are Local: Towards an Action Agenda in Habitat III"</u>.

In the declaration, **local and regional leaders commit to playing their part in the success of the Post-2015 Agenda** and call **for a new global governance system** within a revitalized UN system. The declaration proposes greater participation in the UN for all stakeholders, and demands recognition of the unique democratic legitimacy of local governments in particular.

The declaration also celebrates the inclusion of **SDG 11** on sustainable cities but it also highlights out the need for the 'localization' of all of the 17 SDGs.





#### **5. NEW ON THE CO-PRESIDENCY OF METROPOLIS**

On 23 July, Ada Colau, the Mayor of Barcelona, was named President of the Metropolitan Area of Barcelona (AMB) for the 2015-2019 term of office by the Metropolitan Council, consisting of 36 mayors. Colau is the first woman president of the AMB. A week later, the Extraordinary Metropolitan Council approved the appointment of representatives on the various bodies of the AMB, among them the appointment of Ada Colau as its representative at the Metropolis General Assembly.

The AMB holds one of the six co-presidencies on the Metropolis Board of Directors and plays an important part in the life of the association as it was a founder member of Metropolis.

We would like to thank Xavier Trias for his work over the years he presided over the AMB and would like to congratulate Ada Colau and wish her every success as she assumes her new responsibilities.



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#### 6. VISITS TO THE METROPOLIS SECRETARIAT GENERAL

#### **Barcelona Mayor Visits Metropolis**

The Metropolis Secretariat-General yesterday welcomed the visit of Barcelona Mayor and President of the Metropolitan Area of Barcelona, Ada Colau, together with Senior Deputy Mayor Gerardo Pisarello and Barcelona City Council's International Relations Director, Pablo Sánchez. The mayor and her team met with the outgoing Secretary-General Alan Le Saux, due to step down on 30 September, and the incoming Secretary-General, Felip Roca, who will take up his position on 1 October.

The visit was an opportunity for the new municipal government to learn more about the Association's strategic areas. Ada Colau, who is also the co-president of Metropolis, was very interested in the objectives and opportunities her new responsibility in the Association will afford. Metropolis President Jean-Paul Huchon has extended an invitation to visit him in Paris in the near future.
