Rethinking Metropolitan Governance

October 2019

I. Background and proposal

The World Association of the Major Metropolises (Metropolis) brings together governments from 139 urban agglomerations around the world. With 34 years of history, today the association is the focal point of expertise on metropolitan governance. Raising the voice of metropolises to the global agenda and building capacity to deliver public policies and services, Metropolis contributes to finding common answers to the challenges of metropolization.

In line with the strategic objectives established in the 2018-2020 action plan and with the purpose of strengthening the public administration teams' capabilities, the online training program "Rethinking metropolitan governance" was launched last October 2018. The course offered the basic elements and frames of reference on metropolitan governance with a gender vision. With a duration of 100 hours spread over 14 weeks, it was organized in 3 modules:

- 1. Metropolitan governance: models, variables and challenges.
- 2. The right to the metropolitan city within the framework of the New Urban Agenda and the 2030 Agenda.
- 3. Metropolitan sustainable economic development practices and policies. A critical review.

II. Call

From the existing content of the modules, and with the aim of adapting and updating them, 3 executive summaries will be prepared, one for each of the modules, as well as a total of 6 thematic files, which will reflect the key ideas of the 6 thematic sections present in the different modules of the online training.

The call was launched at the beginning of October 2019, with an extension until last Monday 25 October. During this period, the call has been disseminated, in English and Spanish, through Metropolis's networks and website.

At the end of the deadline, we have received a total of 5 proposals that have been evaluated considering the selection requirements published.

The selection/evaluation criteria have been scored within range 1-3, with 1 being the minimum value and 3 the maximum. On the other hand, the criteria that did not have an answer were indicated with a line.

In this sense, the proposal with the highest score corresponds to Proposal n°4th

III. Selection criteria

Proposals will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- o **Pertinence:** the proposal is aligned with the mission and vision set by the association as well as with its action lines and strategic objectives.
- Gender equality: the applicant person or organization must already be implementing plans, protocols or other instruments to ensure gender equality in his/her place of work.
- Environment: the applicant person or organization must be committed to environmental protection.
- Regional provenance: priority will be given to applicant persons or organizations whose teams come from or include people from countries that are considered low income or lower-middle income, according to current World Bank rankings. For reference, see here.
- o **Composition:** the applicant person or organization's team has a parity composition, would be an asset.
- Budgetary compliance: the proposed cost must be within the available budget for the 'Rethinking metropolitan governance" project consists of 5,000 Euros (including tax).
- Competence: the applicant is able to demonstrate superior competence in gender and public policy analysis.
- Professional experience: the applicant is able to demonstrate a high level of experience in the fields of gender and public policy.
- Academic experience: the applicant is able to demonstrate a high level of research experience in the fields of urbanism and gender.
- Language skills: the applicant demonstrates fluency in the three languages of work of the association: Spanish, English and French.
